For Sir Anish Kapoor and the legendary Carmen Herrera, 'blue is the new black' with their stunning sculptures just two highlights of the 81 specially created artworks at **Cure**³ - the acclaimed annual selling exhibition which opens at Bonham's London on 26th October. Now in its 2nd year, Cure³ is an opportunity to support the ongoing work of The Cure Parkinson's Trust to **find a cure for Parkinson's**.
